EC4WDA RULES CHANGES FOR 2018

Following are official EC4WDA competition rules changes passed by the rules committee during their most recent meeting in November.

PAGE 7

New rule: All automatic transmissions must have a dipstick that cannot be dislodged in the case of an accident. The dipstick can be safety-wired (metal wire only, nylon wire ties are not acceptable) or a locking dipstick may be used.

PAGE 11-12

#23: Change "Remote cables must be metallic (plastic or plastic wrapped cable are not allowed) and installed so they are protected in the event of an upset or a collision."

To: "Remote cable and sheath must be metallic and installed so they are protected in the event of an upset or a collision."

PAGE 25 #11: Change to:

Co-drivers are permitted in all events. A. Vehicle must meet class weight without the co-driver.

B. Co-driver must meet all the safety rules of the driver (arm restraints, fire suit, etc.)

C. Co-driver must be at least 16 years old and be a member of EC4WDA.

D. Co-driver does not need to have a valid driver license.

E. Co-drivers under 18 years of age must have a signed permission from their parent or guardian to enter competitive events.

PAGE 22 #7

A: unchanged: Vehicle cannot be driven in the same class by more trhan one (1) driver, except in timed obstacle course. Limi9t two (2) drivers per class unless track permits three (34) drivers.

Change item B to: A driver can enter a maximum of 2 different classes per vehicle as long as minimum/maximum weight for the class is met. Points will only be awarded to the first class run.

New item C: A driver can only enter once per class.

Change item C to D and now reads: Each vehicle may run unlimited amount of classes but only two classes per driver as long as minimum/maximum weight for vehicle class is met.

Current item D changes to E. If two drivers in one vehicle, one driver may move up one class without meeting maximum weight limits.

PAGE 29 item B Buggy 2WD

Remove requirement 11 "all vehicles must have a working reverse gear."

PAGE 30 Buggy classes change to:

Limited: 4-cylinder air or watercooled engine with a production transaxle transmission (must have a working reverse gear). Front Volkswagen beam type axle and rear swing axle suspension. No turbo or nitrous.

Modified: 4-cylinder or water-cooled engine with a transaxle type transmission. Any front or rear suspension allowed. No turbo or nitrous.

Super Modified: No engine size restrictions. Chain/belt drive allowed in place of a transaxle type transmission for traverse mounted engines.

PAGE 2: new item after F: Recommended that all vehicles have a marked tow point at the front and rear. PAGE 17 (Propane Fuel Systems) new

rule #11:

Must claim performance carburetor. PAGE 35 item D:

Performance Carburetor / Propane Mixer.....15......5

PAGE 65 General 2WD rules; remove "All vehicles will have an onboard fire system in X2WD classes."

PAGE 18 add new item 1b.

Roll cages constructed with 1½ "OD x 0.120" wall steel tubing are allowed in vehicles with non-removable factory hardtop, structurally unaltered doors, and class factor of 12.3 and higher.

Today the last 2 active clubs that joined in 1979 are The Columbia Hill Climbers and Four Wheel Drive Trail Blazers. The next two joined in 1970 and they are I.O.K. 4-Wheelers and Line Mountain Four Wheelers. These two still have the own land and are still holding racing on their property. That is amazing and leads us to our 50th anniversary event. It will be held at the I.O.K race grounds July 5th through the 7th. We are planning on having all kinds of events and this is where we need you, every member from every region to get involved. NOVEMBER 2017 EXEC BOARD MTG MINUTES

President Barry's opening message was highlighted by an appeal to board members that we need to get more members involved. Convention attendance has dropped and there seems to be a loss of interest. Touched in the upcoming 50th Anniversary in 2019. He will be asking for members to step forward and help with the milestone event. Touched again on the realignment issue in a follow-up to the Spring meeting.

Vice-President Steve's report to the board included remarks about Bantam and the fact it is a good outreach for us. Also spoke of the 50th anniversary.

Treasurer Brad submitted Treasurer's Report.

Membership Cathy's report included association numbers and that renewals were out.

Region A chair Bryan Rensi was late for the meeting.

Region B chair Jim mentioned he'd heard his region is struggling in addition to the remainder of the association. Events are not as strong as they were previously and not as viable, especially with the loss of County Line's grounds. He trying to justify the cost of the convention to his region and questions if a convention is really viable.

East Coaster editor Jerry apologized for missing the inclusion of the spring meeting minutes in the paper and printed off an insert that was provided in the packets. Continues to be very difficult in receiving articles from members and clubs, despite encouraging clubs to provide race results for publication. He feels the paper should reflect in the association in its entirety.

Cyber coordinator Brady mentioned looking forward to the convention and he has made some small updates to the website since spring. If clubs have events they wish promoted, they should send the information to him.

Trail boss Ed talked about the association trail ride in the spring in Ohio. There were 11 Jeeps that participated. Will start a little earlier in planning the 2018 event.

Rules chair Chad thanked everyone for being here and he too sees a decline in other events, such as NASCAR. Had one accident this year, a badly burned driver.

Sanctioning chair Larry did some inquiring about insurance for the association and the result was no one is willing to

insure. Asked if we have a D&O policy or liability policy? He received paperwork and costs and will find out more information. Has not heard of any sanctioning issues to date.

Community projects chair Carrie mentioned Bantam and the great time there, inviting everyone to join them next year. Encourages clubs to contact her regarding community projects completed.

GEN'L MTG MINUTES NOVEMBER 11, 2017

President Barry call to order, followed by club roll call and determining quorum. Recognition of veterans in the meeting. Review of motions by Recording Secretary Wendy Forrester. President's Report followed and included remarks concerning a challenge from Barry to the membership to find a way to increase participation. Mentioned a club had come forward and bid for the association's 50th anniversary celebration in 2019. He pointed out it will take a lot of planning, cooperation and especially volunteers to make it happen. He would like to see many events, including trail riding, competition, etc. His hope is that everyone will rise to the challenge presented by the 50th. Barry pointed out the increase in side-by-side vehicles and we have the network to provide that. He encouraged clubs to take advantage of side-by-side competition. Reminded all this is an election year and nominations will take place on Sunday, so please consider running for a position. Thanked all for attending.

Vice President's report by *Steve Forrester* commented on the Bantam Jeep event and encouraged all to attend next year. He reminded all that 2019 is our 50th anniversary and recalled the 20th and 25th anniversaries and the great times remembered.

Brad Shoff, treasurer, reviewed the association's financial report.

Cathy Klotz, Membership Secretary, pointed out things were done a little differently this year concerning club renewals in order to save some money. She pointed out her position possibly might open up for a new person to take over.

Bryan Rensi gave Region A report. He's been communicating with ATV, UTV, racers, etc., to encourage them to consider participating on our association. He has received no feedback from Region A on anything, especially concerning what we might be able to do for them at an association level. He pointed out it is time to make some type of change as what we have now is fading.

Jim Kopfer's Region B report was highlighted by the comment that most of "us know there is a problem within the association but most are at a loss as to what to do about it." There is a drop in the count of competitors as well as spectators. County Line lost their grounds due to environmental concerns. Overall health of the region is OK but not great.

Tom Eaton's Region C report pointed out there was only one (1) sanctioned event this year and noted an obvious increase in the growth of buggies and side-by-sides. Membership has increased and IOK has volunteered to host the association's 50th anniversary event in 2019. There will be another fire ring raffle.

East Coaster report by *Jerry Schwartz* opened with the comment that there is hardly any input from the membership on race event results, community events, etc. Next issue will be early spring.

Brady Forrester gave his cyberspace coordinator report. He's made some new changes to the website with rules changes, layout changes and race results. If your club would like to promote any of your events, contact him.

Trail Boss *Ed McKillip's* report concerned the association's trail ride that was held in May in Wintersville, Ohio.

President Barry mentioned after listening to all the reports, he heard the term "not many changes." He feels we have only about 5% of our membership in attendance at the convention and he has seen a lot of changes over the year with some good and some not. How can we stop the change now. We are not sure how to handle it. He feels the economy has had a big hand in our sports and in motor sports in general. He is hoping we can change things around and help increase attendance. "We, as the board, are always open to any suggestions." One thing that hasn't changed is the camaraderie and the selfless acts that we do for each other and the sportsmanship by watching competitors help each other and clubs working together.

Pappy Fry voting was next. The nominees were Bryan Rensi (A), Dave & Liz Hummel (B) and Tom & Tanya Eaton (C). Ballots were distributed and voting commenced. Ballots were collected and






