## OUR SIDELINED RAFFLE MOVES TO YEAR 2021 THANKS TO COVID-19




# CHC TOPS "B" CLUBS IN POINT STANDINGS

The year started out on a bad note. The first race on our schedule, FLAT-O-RAMA, held by the Delaware 4-Wheelers had to be cancelled because of the Covid scare. The second race was Line Mountain Coal Bucket, which had a great turnout for the non-sanctioned event. The EC4WDA racers, however, were pretty light. The third race was postponed from June until August which unfortunately meant a non-sanctioned race to be held by Susquehannocks had to be cancelled.

Pine Creek 4-Wheelers stepped up to the plate by switching a non-sanctioned event to a sanctioned one to make up for losing a points race. Big question was, will Columbia Hill Climbers finally pull off their 50th Anniversary Race and get the proverbial "monkey off their back?" Well, everything was going good with less than two weeks to go. That was when the bottom fell out once again. The event insurance they thought they had was pulling the plug. Can you say WTF! How much bad luck can a club have? It was believed that there was no way to acquire a new policy with so little time left. The club unfortunately had to announce once again the race was not to be.

Other Region B members encouraged CHC to strive forward. And they did on the hope there was a chance a new policy might be possible. Then, good news

Concerning region election, a "Single Ballot" was approved, meaning all board members will stay in their positions.



### RICHARD GORDON SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD WINNER



# JUNIOR RACING! EC4WDA's SMARTEST MOVE



In the 51 years EC4WDA has been in existence, nothing we have instituted within the framework of the organization has paid the dividends that adopting a junior racing program has. Nothing.

And this is a fair question. What does the <u>picture</u> of Wayne Gunter climbing around in his Jeep have to with that? A lot.

Let's start at the beginning. Early on, EC4WDA was preoccupied with producing races, establishing running rules and sanctioning requirements, growing, regionalizing and taking a great deal of pride and satisfaction in maturing into a safe and fun-family-oriented racing and trail riding group encompassing hundreds of families in a number of states.

Sometime during the 80's, a group of racers within EC4WDA, anxious to establish an alternative racing program as opposed to class racing, got their idea off the ground, and staged races. One aspect of their program caught the attention of the association leadership. They liked

what they saw and were inspired to incorporate the idea within the EC4WDA network. What ASRO (American Sand Racing Organization) was doing was promoting children's racing, something EC4WDA was quite simply lacking.

We initially called it "Junior Jeepers" and later modified it, incorporating the name that survives to this day; Junior Racing. Without a doubt, it has proven to be the smartest thing EC4WDA has ever done. It's difficult to tally how many junior racers have honed their racing skills from an early age to slip into the adult category at age 16. In all respects, it has been and continues to be a very successful program.

Now, back to the picture. Truth be known, the picture of Wayne, by itself, has really nothing to do with junior racing. But the two onlookers, they do.

The gentleman, seemingly amused by Wayne's movements within the vehicle's cage, is Matt Peters and the young lady is his daughter, Zora. She is a 16-year-old graduate of junior racing who entered the



adult phase of the sport this year with a wonderful "racing Jeep" her father built for her. Her racer is a testimonial to her father's genius and certain acumen in engine-building as well as vehicle design.

And Zora's initial foray into adult racing has led her to quite a few tracks in the mid-west, a journey probably not many 16-year-olds could experience while racing with the "big boys". The "Retriever Racing Team" has been to Atoka Motorsports Park, Atoka, Oklahoma (home of Race#2 Mid-America Sand Drag Series), Thunder Valley Sand Drags, Grain Valley, Missouri (near Kansas City, MO), West Michigan Sand Dragway, Mears, Michigan, Gravelrama Park in Cleves, Ohio (Cincinnati), Tri-County 4-Wheelers in Lisbon, Ohio and Bull Run Raceway in Rogers, Ohio. Hopefully, we didn't miss any.

Zora's success is well documented. She has won and lost and her adeptness on the starting line has resulted in remarkable reaction times.

As was pointed out earlier, the adoption of junior racing within the EC4WDA structure is by all measure one of the smartest moves we have ever made. Just ask Matt and Zora Peters.
