The East Coast Four Wheel Drive Association, Inc. (EC4WDA) was founded and incorporated as a non-profit corporation in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1969. Realizing the need to standardize running classes, rules and safety considerations, the three (3) founding clubs; Tri-County 4-Wheelers (Lisbon, Ohio), Allegheny 4-Wheelers (Oil City, Pennsylvania) and Triangle Four Wheelers of Pittsburgh, gathered in State College, Pennsylvania, in the fall of 1969 to establish EC4WDA. Today the association is composed of five (5) geographical regions in eleven (11) states. This publication, "The East Coaster", is the official printed voice of EC4WDA and is mailed to all categories of membership three (3) times a year; February, June and October. 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# TRI-COUNTY'S 50TH!!! EC4WDA FIRST!

A warm, sunny, July Saturday greeted spectators, campers, and competitors, the 25th, when the Tri-County 4-Wheelers (C), one of three original clubs in 1969 that formed EC4WDA, celebrated their 50th annual 4X4 Rodeo, the first club in the association to do so. Although their initial rodeo took place prior to the establishment of EC4WDA, nevertheless they staged their half-century mark with 50 consecutive events and with the exception of just several, all were run under EC4WDA sanctioning.

Their tenure within the association produced several outstanding leaders, including Tucker Cope, who as president of the association in the 70's, conceived the notion of regionalizing the association, the initial split resulting in Regions A and B. Another example was Diane Evans, who became an early president of United Four Wheel Drive Association, the umbrella group that presided over every major regional 4X4 association in the country. Diane's husband, Bob, led the initiative that resulted in the formation of Region C in 1981. Still another was Tom Darling, who was an early advocate of competitive sanctioning and led the association in the development of many rules in force today. Another was Jim Donaldson, who served as president of EC4WDA in the early 70's. Yet another was Martha Mottice who served at the regional level for a number of years. Add Chris Waters to the list, who also served at the regional level as well and also as a chairman of three EC4WDA anniversary competitive events spanning 15 years.

Tom Kennedy, a long-time member of Tri-County, known for his successful

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start-up company called "Four Wheel Drive Hardware", was a generous benefactor to the sport and supported more than one EC4WDA anniversary event with financial backing.

Tri-County's outstanding leadership made an enormous difference over the vears.

The rodeo matured under EC4WDA participation and was one of the largest events for many years within the sanctioned-event stable. Everybody participated in "Lisbon's race", as they called it back in the day. A competitor count of well over 200 was routine.



# Convention-Sunday General Meeting - 11/16/14

- -- Meeting called to order by Barry.
- --Reminded the Association body of room checkout time.
- --First order of business is a by-laws change from last year's convention.

  Terry read by-law change: Article 9 Sec. 1 Item I, Article 11 Sec. 8 Item I.

  Webmaster to Cyberspace Coordinator.

  Call the question. Motion read again by Terry. Voting by flag. No opposition.

  Unanimous. Motion passed.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**:

--Jerry talked about final thoughts on the 45th Anniversary event. Thanked the Pine Creek Four Wheelers for the event namely Craig Carr. Again touched on the lack of participation from the Association than what we had planned for. We lost a substantial amount of money from the event. Other than some personality clashing or viewpoint differences the event on the whole he thought went well. Also thanked Chris Waters and the committee for their hard work. The grounds were immaculate with enlarged camping in anticipation of a larger attendance. Jerry opened up floor for questions and comments. We were unfortunately left with many trophies and dash plaques. Question was asked from Cathy what will we do with the leftover trophies? Barry suggested getting a list of what was left over. Dave Hummel made suggestion of maybe reusing them for the junior achievement program. Kirk Shenberger suggested if someone can give him a list of what was left over and if someone from each region could contact him with what they need maybe he can reuse those trophies. Jerry asked if Craig Carr if he had someone who could take inventory of them and contact Kirk. Cathy suggested maybe opening up the option for clubs to make bids on those trophies who maybe could use them for events that they may be scheduling. Terry stated we should not need a motion for this but leave it up to the 45th Anniversary committee. Sput Wilkinson suggested splitting up the trophies between each region which would help

the clubs with purchasing trophies for their junior racers. Question asked from the floor what size trophies they are and Craig Carr replied they are assorted sized and would basically only need new name plates.

--Barry called upon Cathy to give us a synopsis of Bantam Jeep Festival 2015. Cathy talked a little bit about the events of Bantam 2014 and the good time the Association attendees had. This year it will be held the weekend prior to Father's Day. The Association will hold another potluck meal again for fellowship. Cathy has received info from Patti Jo Lambert. Parade will be held on Friday and will be a two segment parade. Cathy informed the Association that we received a check for \$250.00 from Bantam just for participating and mentioned that she asked the Board if we can use that money to help promote and give recognition to EC4WDA. Rich Bundy mentioned how he helped guide the trail riding event that weekend. Volunteers will be needed for the trail riding event. Cathy encouraged everyone to plan to volunteer and attend. Dates are June 12-14, 2015. Camping reservations start 12/1/14.

--Barry next brought up the topic of jamborees and the expense. The Region chairpersons and the Board made decision to suspend the jamborees and focus more on our target audience. Gave an example of the Bantam Jeep Festival which is located in Region A's area and there are some clubs in that area that currently do not belong to EC4WDA. He talked about jamborees cost us \$850.00 and we only did 2 jamborees last year and with the loss of the Raffle Jeep project that really does not justify the expense. Also focus on PA Jeep Show and an event that Fred Mottice has a connection with. Barry encouraged the Association of anyone has any suggestions of events that may benefit the Association to please let us know. Barry talked about a type of a giveaway such as a water bottle that may also help promote our Association and this can be a very minimal cost item to obtain. Expressed that it has been a struggle to get people to help at the

jamborees. Barry opened up the floor for questions or comments and nothing was mentioned.

-- Next item was the Raffle Jeep. Talked again about the change with the small game of chance licensing and how he found this out when he went to the printers to get the tickets printed. Talked about the time Cathy Klotz has invested in obtaining a small games of chance license for us and how 60% must be donated to a charity and the One of Our Own Fund does not qualify for that charity. Barry talked about the fines and possible jail time that could have come of this if we would have pursued this and he did not want to put the Association at risk for this. The Board then made a decision to sell the Raffle Jeep through a contact that Barry knew from his business. We had approximately \$10,000.00 invested in the Jeep and the Board told him we needed to get \$13,500 for the Jeep. The Jeep was eventually sold. We have tried all options to get around the small games of chance license but we have found no way and will not work. Only decision left was to suspend the Raffle Jeep project and come up with another fundraising project. The Board is asking the Association to come up with a fundraiser. Right now the treasury is okay but looking down the road if we don't have some type of fundraiser we may need to consider a dues increase which hasn't happened for quite a long time. Barry opened up the floor for any type of suggestions. Question asked if we are still obtaining items for the Jeep could we still consider flipping a Jeep as we have done this year. Barry explained that regarding the sponsors they would not receive any type of advertising and he wasn't sure if we would be able to get the same type of donations from our sponsors if all we are going to do is flip a Jeep. Question from floor asked instead of just buying it and flipping it about obtaining a Jeep and taking it to places and not selling chances on it but advertising that it will be auctioned off on Ebay. Barry stated this suggestion was brought up by the Board at their meeting but he wasn't sure

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of the legalities of doing this and maybe Cathy could use her connections that she has with the games of chance license process that she could find something out. Cathy will do some research on this.

--Barry posed the question if we again flip another Jeep which region will do the work on it and do we reward that region in some way since with the Raffle Jeep project that some of the profit is split among all the regions? If anyone has any suggestions, to please contact Barry either via email or telephone call. He again stressed we are not proposing a dues increase at this time but we do need to consider a fundraiser. He asked if anyone had anything else under Old Business to talk about.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

--Barry talked about the car trailer that we have used to transport the Raffle Jeep. He believes it is a late 1990's open deck car trailer and with the loss of the Raffle Jeep project and the trailer is just sitting there that it needs to get some things taken care of such as rust, fenders, etc. Discussion from Executive Board meeting that we should offer it to sale for to our members and if we do pursue another Raffle Jeep that we could purchase a new trailer when needed. Barry is going to take some pictures of the trailer and advertise it in the East Coaster with the next issue coming out in February and accept sealed bids and they are mailed to Wendy Forrester (address in directory) and indicate on envelope it is a sealed bid. The sealed bids will be opened at the Spring Executive Board meeting (meeting date to TBA). He is afraid if we let the trailer set it will get rusty. Opened up the floor for any thoughts or comments. The trailer will be in the February issue of the East Coaster and will help increase our treasury.

-- Next order is the 2015 Convention. Floor opened for comments on the hotel venue. Wendy talked about concerns expressed to her and she will relay to the sales manager when she talks to him tomorrow. Date chosen for 11/13/1511/15/15. Floor opened up for themes:

Theme: "Down on the Farm" Hospitality Room: Region C Continue with theme baskets from each region. Region C will determine the charity that the proceeds go to from the Raffle.

- --Brad mentioned we got charged for breakfast this year and Steve Forrester will check into that. Cathy asked if we could bring back the option of decorating balcony and courtyard rooms and Wendy will incorporate that into the awards listing.
- -- Janey Kelly on 4/18/15-4/19/15 announced there will be a junior event at Gravelrama.
- --Steve Forrester introduced Lindsey from the hotel management staff. Lindsey gave a brief discussion on the toy collection program. Program is called "The Parade of Trees". There are 7 school districts in the county and the county in general is considered a somewhat poor county. The toys go to children who truly need them. Last year the hotel helped 143 students in their school district. They obtain a listing of names of students who truly need help. Talked about local organizations and businesses that also contribute to the program with boots, clothing, etc. They have 160 kids on their list for this year and she thanked the Association for their donation of toys we collected this year. Motion by Terry and seconded by Bryan. \*\*MOTION CARRIED\*\* Barry just expressed this is simply a suggestion for a fundraiser. Brady suggested maybe considering something like Ebay or Craigslist as a venue for selling a Jeep. Steve stressed that we need an alternative for a fundraiser as this Association will not survive on just membership dues. Barry wants us to have a "game plan" and not pursue anything haphazardly and we cannot gamble with the Association's money. Bryan feels we should discuss this with the body and table it for a year as there are so many variables with everything and we cannot take a risk. Barry feels we can get through a year without a dues increase and stressed that we need the Association body's input. Sput feels we need to take a look at a dues increase as it will help alleviate the burden of those who have worked or transported the Raffle Jeep. Bryan feels Please see "MINUTES" Page 14

the trailer is a 1998. \*\*\*MOTION\*\*\* I move that the Association take no less than \$800.00 for the car trailer to be opened at a sealed bid at the spring Executive Board meeting. Motion made by Steve Forrester and seconded by Chad Owens. \*\*MOTION CARRIED\*\*. Barry stated a deadline date will be announced to the Association body when the sealed bids are due. They will be mailed to Wendy Forrester and opened at the spring executive board meeting. -- Cathy stated it would be nice if we had some EC4WDA information stocked up on hand for such events such as Bantam. Barry will talk to Jerry and maybe come up with some inexpensive ideas for promotional items such as water bottles,

- --Barry had suggested that each club compile a history of information, pictures, etc. that can be scanned and incorporated onto a DVD that clubs can use as a delegate gift from the convention and also help the clubs to promote the Association and educate younger members.
- --Discussion from Barry and Jerry about a special recognition award that was created

for Sugar. It was going to be presented to Sugar at the banquet Sat. night but Sugar was unable to attend the convention. Discussion on videotaping the presentation for her to view and calling her on the phone during the presentation. -- Monte brought up topic of cancelling or suspending the Garneau award due to the difficulty in choosing a recipient. Barry agrees maybe we should suspend the award and then coming back with specific guidelines for a recipient to be nominated. Region C agrees we should suspend it for next year. Region A agrees we should suspend it with reservation. Region B agrees to suspend it until further clarification is determined with guidelines in writing. Carrie feels maybe each region should decide whether or not to participate in the Garneau award and not suspend entirely. Discussion on renaming the award.


